



A Note From The Director

Thank you for coming out to see *The Odd Couple, Female Version* today – I have loved every second of directing this show and I hope you love every second of watching it! I couldn't have asked for a better show or cast for my first time directing. Whether you're a long time *Odd Couple* fan or this is your first encounter with the iconic duo, welcome!

The Odd Couple has a rich comedy history, starting in 1965 with the original play by Neil Simon, which performed on Broadway for over two years and won four Tony awards. The first movie adaptation, also written by Neil Simon, came out in 1968 and was a hit (with a sequel in 1998). The Odd Couple television show ran from 1970-1975 (with a reunion movie in 1993), followed by one season of The Oddball Couple, which featured a neat cat named Spiffy and a sloppy dog named Fleabag. The New Odd Couple television show ran from 1982 to 1983. This is when The Odd Couple, Female Version (again written by Neil Simon) took to Broadway in 1985 and performed for eight months. This production starred Sally Struthers as Florence and Rita Moreno as Olive. It was also Tony Shalhoub's Broadway debut (Jesus). Finally, the most recent TV adaptation was released in 2015, with Matthew Perry starring as Oscar.

However you've encountered *The Odd Couple* in the past, we hope tonight's performance is a memorable one!
