


Edward Albees Whos Afraid of Virginia Woolf?

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A Note From The Director

Edward Albee's *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?* has a rich history in American theater. Written in 1962, and first staged that same year, the play won the Tony Award for Best Play in 1963, as well as the 1962-63 New York Drama Critics' Circle Award for Best Play. A film adaptation in 1966 won the Best Actress Oscar for Elizabeth Taylor and Best Supporting Actress for Sandy Dennis.

The dramatic overtones seen throughout this three-act play are sometimes brutal as the story unravels. However, we are rewarded with some of the finest playwriting ever written. The story takes place over the course of one evening (or one early morning), in the Northeastern small college town of New Carthage. George is a history professor at the local university. Martha has invited a much-younger married couple for drinks following an earlier party. What ensues is a finely-crafted Masterclass in human relationships. The characters in the play are meaty, bold, often brass, occasionally crass, and even at times difficult to watch. But what you'll see as the story unfolds are four vastly different characters that are multidimensional and fascinating to watch.

Bringing these characters to life has been a challenge. The layers each character brings to the stage have evolved into a powerful and sometimes moving portrait of relationships, which can at times be dysfunctional. I hope you'll appreciate the immense beauty of Albee's storytelling.




